

THE CHOIRS

Promenade Choir

The Promenade Choirs are outstanding choral ensembles for young singers and musicians living in Elmbridge and beyond. They rehearse in Hersham, put on public concerts every term and take part in local events. Our ensembles are nonauditioned, catering for singers aged from 7 to 21 years, and offer members professional musical and technical expertise. The choir's next concert, on 24th March, will be a performance of Handel's Messiah at St James's Church in Weybridge. An international singer of distinction, Christopher now dedicates himself to education. He founded the Promenade Choirs in 2008 and has built their reputation for excellence. Repertoire ranges from major Classical works, such as Handel's Messiah and Rutter's Feel the Spirit, to contemporary Popular and Music Theatre songs. The Junior Choir caters for boys and girls from 7 or 8 years old, rehearsing from 6.30 to 7.40pm on Monday evenings. Experienced members of the Youth Choir mentor and support new members to ensure they feel immediately included. The Youth Choir caters for young singers from 11 or 12 years old and above, rehearsing from 7.45 to 9pm on Monday evenings.
